# Clint High School Dress Code

Guidelines for 2022-2023	Do's	Don'ts
Head: Students are not allowed to wear any out of the ordinary attire (e.g. bandanas, spikes, gloves or dental grills). Hats/ head coverings will not be worn inside the building. If a student wishes to wear a hat or head covering for religious purposes, prior approval from the campus administrator must be acquired.		
Hair: Student's hair must be well groomed at all times. Hair colors/cuts/designs/hair extensions that distract others in a manner that interferes with instructional activities are not allowed. (Natural hair colors: black, brown, blonde, natural red).		
Jeans/ Pants:  No baggy style pants shall be allowed. Pajamas will not be worn unless during an activity that has been approved by the administration. Pants or jeans may be frayed if they do not draw undue attention. The frayed areas should be minimal and any student who has gaping holes due to the frayed areas will change. Students may wear undergarments under frayed pants, but must still meet the criteria above. Pants will not be excessively tight. Overall pants, sweat pants, athletic pants are not allowed.		

## Clint High School Dress Code

#### **Shorts/ Skirts:**

Shorts may be worn year-round, and coaches will approve appropriate shorts for athletic events. Students may wear shorts year-round. Shorts will be walking type.

Shorts/skorts/skirts will not exceed 3 inches above the knee or be below the top of the calf muscle. Shorts that are not acceptable include cut-off, home-made, and athletic styles. Spandex shorts are not allowed unless during athletic events. Overall shorts are not allowed.





#### Tops:

Tank tops and half t-shirts shall not be worn. Any color t-shirt (with or without pockets) is considered acceptable. White under shirts will not be worn as outer garments. Shirts will not be buttoned to top button. No bare midriffs will be allowed (no visible navels). Undergarments are required when deemed necessary by appropriate personnel. district prohibits pictures, emblems, or writings on clothing that: are lewd or offensive; depict alcohol, tobacco, or drugs; or indicate gang affiliation









### **Piercings and Tattoos:**

Earrings may be worn by all secondary students - only on the ear lobe and must not bring undue attention to the student. No jewelry, hardware, gauges or temporary materials may be worn or visible body piercings/tongue piercings.

Students must cover tattoos whenever possible so that undue attention is not brought to the student.















**Note:** Students in violation of the dress code will have the opportunity to resolve the issue before disciplinary steps are taken. Resolution may include calling home for a change of clothes, going to the office for a shirt, covering a tattoo, or removing a piercing. Habitual dress code violation may result in disciplinary action and/ loss of privilege.
