This fall's Faculty Development theme, "Becoming a Better You for Your Students and Yourself," represents our collective efforts to enhance the student experience, and this week's workshops show a variety of ways we can meet that goal, from learning about high-impact instructional practices to engaging with college projects and programs. I hope that this week provides time to reflect and engage with your colleagues and disciplines and to get energized for a successful fall semester!

I want to update faculty about the college's response to SB18 and SB17. The college's post-tenure review process has been in place for

one academic year, and I appreciate faculty's cooperation and patience as we have enacted this new evaluation process to comply with SB18. I invite you all to attend the **Post Tenure Workshop, taking place on Wednesday, August 21, 2024, from 10:00-10:50 a.m. at the ASC Auditorium**, to learn more about the process and provide feedback. The college has also modified procedures, practices, and programs to comply with SB17's DEI mandates.

As always, we have been busy in the Division of Instruction and Workforce Education. The college is creating and piloting the **Opportunity High School Diploma (OHSD)** program as part of its response to HB8. The program will target local adults who do not have a high school diploma. These students will be co-enrolled in a competency-based high school curriculum and a Career and Technical Education workforce program. This program will allow EPCC to award successful students with both a high school diploma and a college credential. EPCC formed faculty affinity groups representing the five major high school competencies, and these faculty affinity groups have developed learning objectives for the high school curriculum. EPCC plans to roll out its OHSD program later this year, and we look forward to reporting its outcomes.

EPCC is also embarking on innovative program work in the aerospace field. This summer, students began joint **UTEP-EPCC courses for Integration Technician and Instrumentation Technician**. Students are engaging in a 24-week online course designed and taught by UTEP Aerospace Center faculty with hands-on training at EPCC's Advanced Technology Center. Upon training completion, students will begin an 8-week paid internship with one of the Aerospace



Center's defense and aerospace industry partners with the aim of gaining full-time employment. Thank you to Mr. Blayne Primozich, AVP of Workforce and Continuation Education, and his workforce team for their great work.

The **MDP 8-Week Campus Pilot Project** initiative has demonstrated remarkable success during its first year of implementation. When compared to the previous year, enrollment at MDP increased by 15% in fall 2023 and 22% in spring 2024. Course completion rates were 81% in fall 2023 and 82% in spring 2024. I would like to again acknowledge Mr. Joshua Villalobos, Campus Dean, and the MDP faculty, campus coordinators, and staff for all their work and commitment to planning and executing this successful project to improve student retention and completion.

The **EPCC/UTEP Engineering Academy**, another inventive project to enhance student success, will launch its first cohort of students this fall. Kudos to Dr. Rebecca Escamilla, Dean of Architecture, Art, Math & Science, and her team for their extensive work planning and implementing this great partnership with UTEP.

We have additional exciting news to share about our Division's impactful student services. **EPCC Cares**, a mental health program, provides therapeutic services to students by licensed clinicians. Services are free and available in-person or virtually. Students can also benefit from **EPCC's Family Friendly Campus (FFC)**, a program that supports student parents, especially single moms, boost their overall completion rates. As part of the FFC, the Student Parent Resource Centers provide a welcoming study space for EPCC student parents, caregivers, and their children, and the Centers are now open at all five campuses with Lactation Rooms at NW, RG, TM, and VV. This fall, Lactation Pods will be installed at ASC, MDP, NW, RG, and VV. Pods are intentionally designed for privacy and comfort, and its keyless entry app provides greater accessibility. Please share information about these programs with your students so that they can utilize the valuable services available to them. Thank you, Dr. Paula Mitchell, AVP of Instruction and Student Success, and Ms. Lucia Rodriguez, Director of the Office of Student Success, who are providing great leadership and oversight to ensure a smooth operation.

I hope to see and meet many of you as I walk the campuses this semester. Please take good care of yourselves and you have my very best wishes for an awesome Fall 2024 Semester!

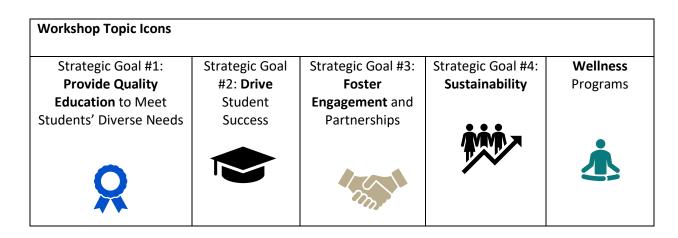

CRITERIA FOR AWARDING FACULTY DEVELOPMENT CREDIT

*As determined and approved by the Faculty Professional Development Committee, reviewed Summer 2022.

- ✓ Credit will apply to the semester during which the workshop is offered, not future semesters.
- ✓ Credit will apply only if there is a minimum of 50 minutes of development programming.
- ✓ Credit will not be awarded for meetings, college governance, or any other activity that is not development.
- Credit can only be awarded if someone has applied and provided information about the workshop to the Faculty Development Office. Requests can be reviewed after the fact if documentation is submitted, but this is not a guarantee credit can be awarded.
- ✓ To earn Faculty Development credit, participants and presenters attending or presenting virtual workshops MUST sign in using the Attendance URL link or QR codes within the time range of the workshop.
- ✓ All requests will be reviewed by the Faculty Development Office for compliance with the criteria.
- ✓ Requests requiring further review will be presented to and reviewed by the Faculty Professional Development Committee.

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PRESENTER'S NETIQUETTE RULES FOR ONLINE WORKSHOPS

- 1. Arrive to the session at least **10 minutes early**.
- 2. Ensure that your microphone and your camera are working.
- 3. Upload any shareable files and open any windows you will display. Maximize windows or enlarge font sizes. Use the Ctrl + Scroll Up/Down button on your mouse wheel to zoom on most pages. Adjust participant settings, like speaker and chat controls.
- 4. Outline instructions to allow participants an equal chance to speak if the presentation allows.
- Find the Attendance URL link—emailed to you last semester and share it in the chat window multiple times during your session. (Participants will only receive attendance credit if they click and complete your attendance URL within your presentation's time slot)
- 6. Provide any other "house rules" that you may have. These may need to be repeated.
- 7. Make sure there is enough Wi-Fi bandwidth for your meeting by having others in your household refrain from being online at the same time as your workshop. In addition, make sure to close all unnecessary programs on your computer. If you are still having problems, have everyone turn off their cameras.
- 8. Faculty Development Credit will be awarded to PRESENTERS, if you sign in within the workshop's time and use the Attendance URL. No sign in = No credit.

PARTICIPANT'S NETIQUETTE RULES FOR ONLINE WORKSHOPS

- 1. Arrive to the session at least 10 minutes early.
- 2. Ensure that your microphone is muted, and camera is off. If the presenter encourages cameras to be on, then be respectful by paying attention and not becoming a distraction.
- 3. Raise your hand before speaking and allow everyone an equal chance to speak.
- 4. Find the Attendance URL link—posted by the presenters in the chat window during the session to receive attendance credit. (Participants will only receive attendance credit if they click and complete this Attendance URL link within the presentations' time slot)
